The word "saved" comes from a Greek word, "sozo." Sozo means to save, heal, deliver, preserve, do well, make whole, keep safe and sound, and to rescue from danger and destruction.
Every work of God is a work of grace, a divine influence in the heart that makes one able.
Grace makes us able to walk in healing, makes us to be all that God said we could be. It is His power, not ours.

The word "frustrate" means to set aside,, disannul, nullify, make void or reject.
When we try to be righteous and acceptable to God by our works we neutralize God's ability. His power no longer works in our lives we are left to our own ability.

After a person has received Jesus as Lord and Savior he is to be baptized in water. He is to believe (consider/reckon) that his old life and his old nature died with Christ on the cross. By trusting in the power of God he is to believe that he is raised up as a new person, with a new nature, just as Christ was raised from the dead.

Based on this belief, the new believer is to bury the old man. In water baptism we demonstrate our faith in the fact that we are dead. We also demonstrate our faith in the fact that we are now raised from the dead in Him. For many this is the place where grace/empowerment to live the new life becomes a reality. It is here that we experience the reality of death burial and resurrection.

In all of the instances of believers receiving the baptism in the Holy Spirit, they all spoke with tongues. By reading the following scriptures we see that there are three reasons for us to speak in tongues:

People mistakenly think that the Holy Spirit will make them speak in tongues or that He will speak for you. The Bible clearly points out that it was the believers who spoke in tongues, not the Holy Spirit. The Spirit never forces anyone to do anything. But, when a believer decides to act on the promises of God, the Holy Spirit will certainly do His part. We speak; the Spirit gives the words.

HOW TO RECEIVE THE BAPTISM IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

- 1. Receive Jesus as Lord and Savior.
- 2. Believe that the Baptism in the Holy Spirit is for you.
- 3. Ask Jesus to baptize you in the Holy Spirit.
- 4. Receive by faith. This has nothing to do with your feelings.
- 5. Act on your faith.
 - a. Thank the Lord for baptizing you in the Holy Spirit. Worship Him for answering your prayers.
 - b. Begin to speak in tongues. You might ask, "But, how will I know it's not me speaking in tongues?" It will be you. You do the speaking, the Holy Spirit supplies the words.
